<b>8.59 CENTREPOINT</b>	<b>£8,500.00</b>
Towards the salary costs of a Learning and Work Advisor at the Salters' Foyer which provides accommodation and support services for up to 44 young people at a time.	
<b>CAMDEN ARTS CENTRE</b>	<b>£2,500.00</b>
12 disadvantaged young people aged 14-19 will take part in arts based workshops and develop individual artworks to be displayed at an exhibition organised by the whole group.	
<b>CENTRAL AND CECIL HOUSING TRUST</b>	<b>£5,000.00</b>
Towards the costs of the personal development programme for young women at the Albert Street Hostel. Each individual is offered a package of life skills and IT training, counselling sessions and careers advice to help secure further training or employment.	
<b>CITY UNIVERSITY</b>	<b>£5,000.00</b>
20 disadvantaged young people will take part in a 12 week project to learn how to build and race karts. Students and staff from the University engineering department mentor the participants who will also have chance to brush up on key skills.	
<b>DRAKE MUSIC PROJECT</b>	<b>£5,500.00</b>
Towards an eight week music project for 15 young disabled people providing opportunities for participants to create, record and perform music.	
<b>GROOVEYOURARTS</b>	<b>£4,188.00</b>
A 19 week street dance project will be run at Hornsey Lane Estate and Whittington Park Community Centre for up to 20 young people to learn new skills and create a series of dance routines that will be performed to the local community.	
<b>THE FILM AND VIDEO WORKSHOP</b>	<b>£4,000.00</b>
Six year 6 children with special educational needs at Brecknock Primary School will create a video about transferring to secondary school. They will interview other children in the year as well as students and staff at secondary schools to help reduce some of the anxiety that children face when changing schools.	
<b>THE LITTLE ANGEL THEATRE</b>	<b>£6,000.00</b>
Towards the Puppets for All project. Up to 113 children from low income or disadvantaged backgrounds will have the opportunity to take part in fun days and weekly puppet making workshops.	
<b>UCANDOIT</b>	<b>£3,075.00</b>
One to one home based IT training for up to six deaf, blind and disabled people living in Camden and Islington.	
<b>UNTIL THE VIOLENCE STOPS (Tender)</b>	<b>£4,500.00</b>
For a ten week workshop based project to help vulnerable young women at Parliament Hill School address issues of domestic and sexual violence.
