Helping young people stay on course

What does the Foundation do?

We help individuals and families on low incomes by making grants towards the costs of education and we will also consider funding some of the costs involved when starting work. Every year we assist up to 1,000 young people stay in education and gain new skills.

Who can apply?

You have to be **under 25 years** of age (though in exceptional circumstances this can sometimes be extended to 40) **and either:**

- you or your parent/s have lived or worked in the boroughs of Camden, Islington or City of London for the last 12 months or at least two out of the last ten years
- or
- you have been a student at a school, college or university in one of these three boroughs for at least one year and are continuing to study at the institution

How often can I apply?

You can make one application each academic year.

Does it matter which course I am doing?

If you are studying full or part time at a state run school, college or university and the course will result in a recognised qualification then you will probably be eligible to apply. Eligible courses include:

- GCSEs, AS or A2 levels, AVCEs
- Vocational courses such as BTEC, GNVQs, HNCs and HNDs
- Foundation and degree level courses at universities
- Postgraduate study (essential qualifications only)

What can you help with?

Grants are available to help with:

- Maintenance costs, including travel, books and equipment
- UK based field trips that are an essential part of your course
- Course fees (depending on what course you are studying and your individual circumstances)
- The cost of training or apprenticeship or tools and equipment for those starting work
- The cost of specialist tuition or treatment



What can't you fund?

We are unable to make grants for:

- Computers
- Holidays
- Clothing
- Child care costs
- Fees at private schools or colleges (except where we agree that education within the state system would be inappropriate)
- Overseas trips and placements

How much can I apply for?

This depends on your individual circumstances and what other types of loans, grants or income you have. Our grants are normally between £150 - £1,000.



How do I apply?
